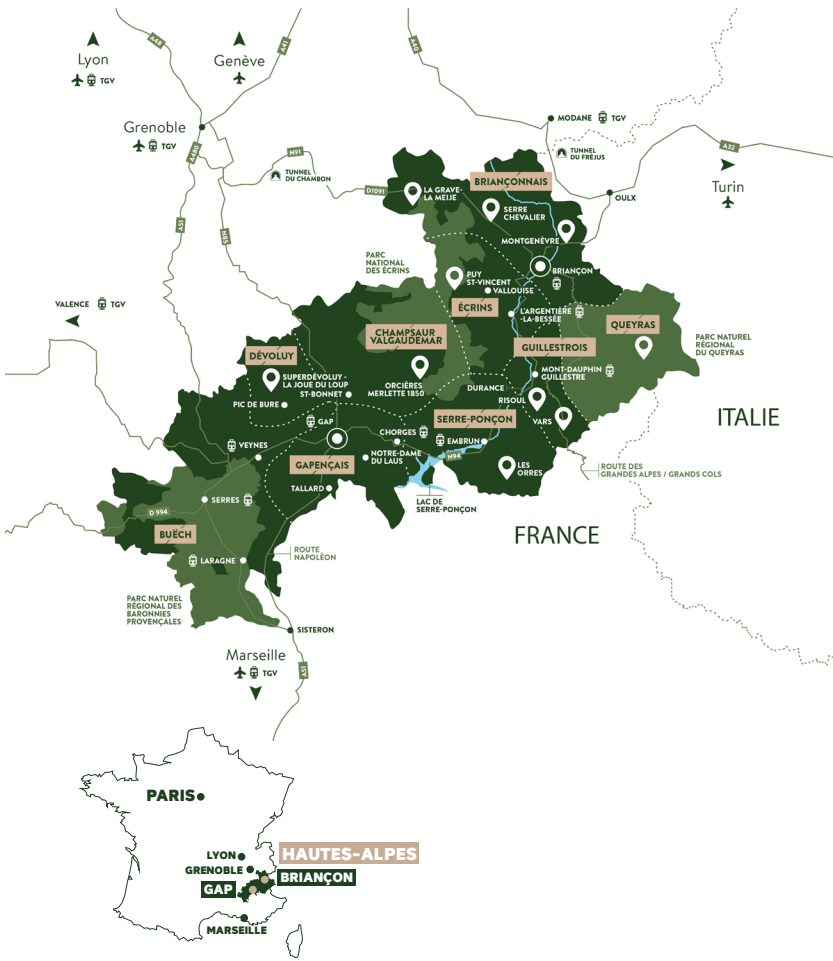

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A « PHENOMEN'ALPS » PLAYGROUND

Galibier, Izoard... the Hautes-Alpes are proud of their legendary mountain passes. There are 25 in all, the most prestigious of which are along the famous Route des Grandes Alpes (Great Alpine Road) Ideal for cycling, such sites are legend thanks to the Tour de France.

12 circuits and 21 uphill routes called **Itinéraires Partagés** (Shared Routes) have been specially created for cyclists.

In July and August some of the passes are reserved for cyclists during the **Cols Réservés** (Reserved Passes) operation.



Mountain bike enthusiasts are spoilt for choice: There are mountain biking sites that are classed Fédération Française de Cyclisme (French Cycling Federation), the Grande Traversée des Hautes-Alpes (Great Hautes-Alpes Crossing, 350 kilometres of trails from La Grave to Laragne), numerous Bike Parks that can be accessed using the ski lifts during the summer and a myriad of major events.

Synonymous with effort for quite some time, mountain cycling has been revolutionised thanks to electrically assisted bicycles.



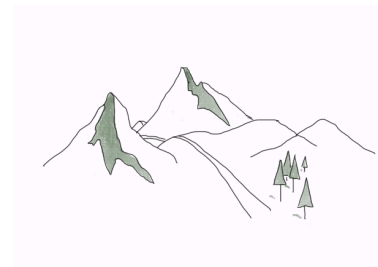

A HIKING
EL DORADO

The Hautes-Alpes have 1,800 kilometres of **Grandes Randonnées** (GR-Great Hiking Routes), 5,000 kilometres of **Petites Randonnées** (short walks) and a good dozen of **Tours de Pays** (local circuits) and are most certainly a paradise for those who enjoy walking, hiking or trekking.

The footpaths throughout the Hautes-Alpes are varied and offer an incredible natural diversity as they cross the **Parcs naturels régionaux du Queyras** and the **Baronnies Provençales** (Queyras and Baronnies Provençales Regional Natural Parks), the **Parc National des Écrins** (Écrins National Park) and nine sectors that include fields of lavender, orchards or glaciers. They can be followed alone or accompanied by a mountain guide or leader.



At the end of a hike, or to have a break, make the most of the **refuge** huts where experienced mountaineers and hikers share their experiences and dream together. There are 45 in the Hautes-Alpes. Some, like the **Gioberny refuge**, are easy to access, others, such as the recently renovated **Aigle refuge** (Eagle refuge) are legendary.

THE WAY

Above 3,000 metres in altitude, ice is master. A blue-tinted metallic shell, forms a strange environment with striking lace-like intricacies.

Under the supervision of a mountain guide, the climb up the glaciers of the Écrins, the Valgaudemar or the Meije can begin. The Barre des Écrins, the highest summit in the Hautes-Alpes culminates at an altitude of 4,102 metres.



Orpierre is famous all around the world.

At the foot of a rocky cirque, the vertiginous rock faces are 1,200 metres high. Further north, close to Gap, in Sigoyer in the Tallard-Barcelonnette sector, the **Céüse** rock face is also well-known to climbers. The most difficult climbing routes in the world are alongside a via-ferrata.

Throughout the Hautes-Alpes there are numerous climbing routes, as there are via ferrata and international events. The most emblematic ones are the Mondial d'Escalade de Briançon (Briançon World Climbing) and the Tout à Blocs des Écrins.

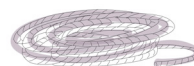

SAILING AND WHITE WATER SPORTS



WATER
ACTIVITIES

Durance, Guil, Guisane, Drac, almost 2,000 kilometres of rivers cross the area, 500 of which are suitable for white water sports such as rafting, kayaking, hot-dog canoeing and white water swimming. The white water facility on the Durance River in l'Argentière-La Bessée, sets the standard in Europe, as does the surprising vague du Rabiou (Rabiou Wave). The south of the departement is not to be left out, it also benefits from the Durance with some superb canoe-kayak routes.



The Lac de Serre Ponçon (Serre-Ponçon lake) adds a nautical dimension. The thermal winds and the geography of the place make it an excellent spot for kite-surfing and windsailing, not forgetting recreational boating, kayaking or stand-up paddling. Finally, the glacier and snow-fed mountain lakes such as Pétarel or Lauzon, encourage hiking, fishing and relaxation.

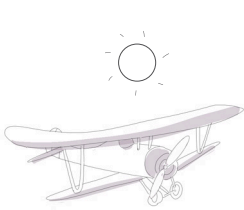
OPEN AIR
ACTIVITIES

Due to exceptional climatic and upper air conditions, as well as the variety of the landforms, the Hautes-Alpes are the ideal place for aviation activities.

In total, 330 days of flying take place each year, there are four aerodromes (**Gap-Tallard**, **Saint Crépin**, **Le Chevalet** in **Aspres-sur-Buëch** and **La Batie-Monsaléon**) and more than 20 sites for free flying some of which, like la **Montagne de Chabre**, near to **Laragne** are internationally renowned.



The aerodrome of **Gap-Tallard** is recognized as Europe's first aviation leisure centre. Indeed, all aeronautic activities are possible here. There is a wide range of possibilities: first flight in a glider, paragliding, microlight, gyrocopter, hot air balloon, a tandem free fall, helicopter flight, pilot's course. Internationally renowned, the aerodrome welcomes many users but is also the stage for important events particularly for parachuting. Guided visits of the aerodrome are possible.

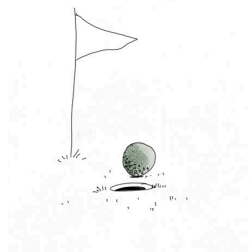

The two **golf courses** in the Hautes-Alpes, Gap-Bayard and Montgenèvre, are synonymous with pure air and amazing views over the surrounding summits and the pleasant golf courses.

Neighbouring the Italian golf course in Clavière, **Montgenèvre** offers an 18-hole international course. This mountain golf course is at the bottom of the slopes and the starting point for hole number one is in the heart of the village.

Gap-Bayard also has an 18-hole golf course. Accessible to golfers of all levels, the course is considered technical and varied. Each hole offers a different view over the mountains of the Parc National des Écrins (Écrins National Park) or the hills of the Val de Durance. It is probably one of the most beautiful mountain golf courses in France.



DISCOVER WIDE
OPEN SPACES

The Hautes-Alpes enclose natural treasures and through the diversity and wilderness constitute a unique field of play that includes natural parks, Natura 2000 zones, high mountains, apple and pear orchards, fields of lavender, great passes, impetuous rivers, waterfalls and lakes.

Prestigious flowers such as blue thistles, rhododendrons, gentians, edelweiss and orange lilies can be spotted along the footpaths whereas marmots, ibex, mouflons and chamois roam the rock faces and pastures. For more curious visitors, a stop at the **Jardin du Lautaret** (Lautaret Alpine Botanical Garden) is a must. Among the most beautiful in Europe, 4,500 m² of rockery are home to 2,000 plant species. The **Conservatoire Botanique National Alpin de Charance** in Gap (National Alpine Botanical Conservatory) is also a must.

The Hautes-Alpes are also greatly appreciated by fishers: streams, rivers, altitude lakes and even Serre-Ponçon provide good catches for anglers or fly-fishers.

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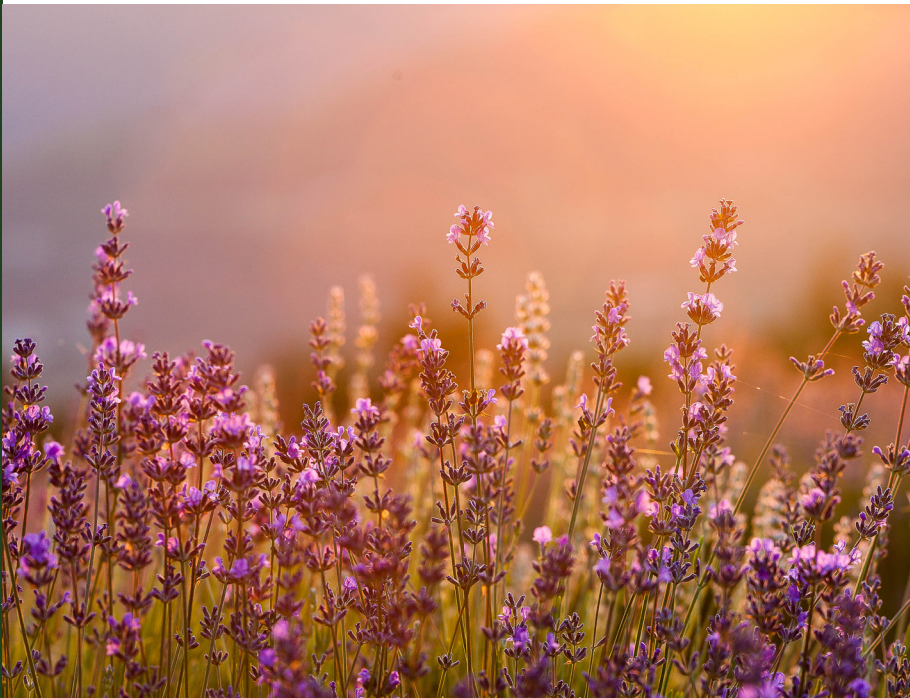

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ENLIVEN YOUR SENSES

The **Grands Bains du Monétier** in Serre Chevalier have been drawing naturally hot beneficial spring water (44°C cooled to 37°C) for as long as can be remembered. The Grands Bains thermal baths have become a reference in the Alps. Nearby, two biotopic lakes have recently been created. Naturally warm waters also exist at the **Plan de Phazy** near to Guillestre.



In Montgenèvre, the **Durancia** aquatic centre opened at the foot of the slopes in February 2015. This beautiful installation offers a balneo-recreation area, a well-being area and a spa. In 2019, the O'dycéa center opens its doors in the Dévoluy. Other facilities have recently been opened in Saint-Bonnet en Champsaur, Embrun, and Risoul and a considerable amount of accommodation is equipped with a spa.

In the summer, the **Lac de Serre-Ponçon** (Serre-Ponçon Lake), the **Gorges de la Méouge** (Méouge Gorges) and the multiple water bodies and high altitude lakes are refreshing.



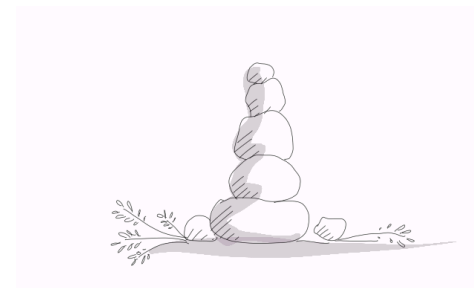

FOLLOW THE FOOTSTEPS OF HISTORY

The nooks and crannies of the Hautes-Alpes became true melting pots following the passages of **Vauban** and **Napoleon**. Between plains and summits, numerous religious buildings and strong holds are hidden away deep in the valleys or exhibited on rocks.

Among the most remarkable are: **Briançon**, **Mont-Dauphin**, **Embrun**, **Boscodon**, **Notre-Dame du Laus**, **Château de Montmaur** and the medieval castle in **Tallard**. The **Via Alta** is an itinerary that follows a major part of this cultural heritage.

Other features well worth a visit are: the **Musée Museum Départemental de Gap** (Department museum), the **Géo-parc des Alpes Cotiennes** (Cotian Alps Geopark), the **Jardin du Lautaret** (Lautaret Alpine Botanical Garden), the **Conservatoire Botanique de Charance** (The Charance Botanic Conservatory), **La Passerelle** National Stage in Gap, the cultural space of **Chaillol** and the astronomy observatories in the **Queyras**, the **Buëch** and the **Dévoluy**.

The programme of cultural and scientific events and shows is particularly rich.

At an altitude of 2,040 metres, **Saint-Véran**, where it is said “cockerels peck at the stars”, is one of the **Plus beaux villages de France** (Most Beautiful Villages of France). Tradition is omnipresent. Log-built chalets, larch wood fountains and sundials give a unique charm to the highest district in Europe.



La Grave is also among the Plus beaux villages de France (Most beautiful villages in France). Architecture in the Buëch is totally different, the villages of **Serres**, **Garde-Colombe** (recently accredited **Petites Cités de Caractères**) **Rosans** or **Orpierre** give a taste of the mountains of Provence. Houses, fountains, communal ovens, religious buildings, the mountain heritage will have something to seduce you.

Whether derived from legends, local memory or historical facts, the Hautes-Alpes are packed with traditions that are passed down from generation to generation.

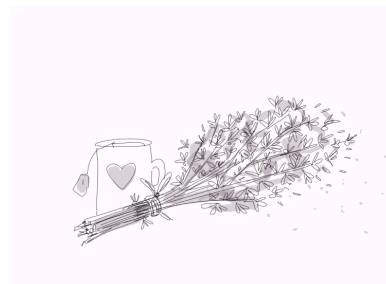


LOCAL GASTRONOMY



FESTIVE MEALS

In the Buëch and Gap areas, the mild climate brings a touch of Provence and enables growth of Mediterranean plants such as lavender, thyme and lime tree. In the Durance valley, however, arboriculture developed and many apple and pear orchards cover the valleys. Vineyards of **Mollard**, an endemic variety of grape, maintains its position. Finally, from the Dévoluy to the Champsaur, via the Queyras or the Briançon area, sheep, goat, cattle or pig breeding is widely practiced.



The **Pommes des Alpes** from Haute-Durance and **Sisteron lamb** qualify for Indication Géographiques Protégées and Label Rouge (Protected Geographical Identifications and Red Label). As for the **Bleu du Queyras**, it aspires to becoming a PDO (Protected Designation of Origin).

These healthy products are promoted by the local brand **Hautes-Alpes Naturellement** (Hautes-Alpes Naturally). Typical recipes are tourtons from the Champsaur, oreilles d'ânes from the Valgaudemar, the Seille from Veynes, trout in Chateauroux les Alpes, honey-based desserts and so on.

They figure on the menus of Michelin-star chefs, restaurants and bistros in the area.

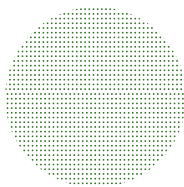

Le Rooftop

A promising new address has arrived on the banks of the Embrun lake. The Rooftop is a restaurant and a lounge bar with a view over the Embrun lake, the Serre-Ponçon lake and the Parpaillon massif, from the Morgon peak to the Orres ski resort. The eating area consists of an 80 seater dining room where you can enjoy a menu based on fresh local produce. On the rooftop, the lounge bar offers cocktails, local beers, tapas style food and « home made » cheese and local charcuterie platters.



La Robeyère joins the Best Western Signature Collection

La Robeyère Hotel welcomes you in the heart of the Hautes-Alpes in an exceptional location. This old XVIIIth century home blends the charm of old local stone with surrounding nature. Perched on the Embrun Roc, the Robeyère offers an astonishing panoramic view over the mountains and the 3-hectares wooded park. The hotel has made numerous changes and renovations to integrate the Best Western Signature Collection and obtain its 4th star before the end of the first 2020 trimester. The new Spa « Les Bains de La Robeyère by Ahimsa » perfects the Robeyère experience by providing a completely relaxing atmosphere with its various treatments. The water from these multiple baths and the sun from the breathtaking-view-terrace will convince you.



Alpin D'Home

Eric Reynaud has created an audacious high standing resort in Les Orres. This resort offers unusual accommodation in a 40 square meter geodesic area which communes with nature. Nine cocoons have been raised on stilts to contemplate nature through the large transparent 160° bay windows. Inside the domes, wood and transparent materials create a luminous atmosphere during the day and a warm atmosphere in the evening ; a pellet stove will keep you warm during your contemplative evenings and through the night. There will be three additional domes as well as a 200 square meter spa.



The Serre-Ponçon lake and its port authority

The Serre-Ponçon lake's port authority is at the forefront of the new development strategy which has been in place now for several years. It has allowed the diversification of the range of aquatic leisure activities on this Alpine lake. The port authority ensures the technical management of the whole lake, while providing nautical services such as a launch slipway with a harbour quay, refitting area, dry port facilities and a fuel distribution area on a pontoon.

Hydraulic dam management

The Hautes-Alpes Department deliberated in order to manage the local hydraulic dams via Public-Private Hydroelectric Partnerships, particularly for Serre-Ponçon. At a time when France is being called upon by the European Commission to open management of its 150 dams to competition, inhabitants of the Hautes-Alpes are taking part in the debate and voicing a unique position: that of territories. The idea is to manage these constructions in order to preserve a rare and fragile resource, regulate use in the best way and distribute the wealth generated equitably. The challenge is huge as water is undeniably one of the greatest concerns for the century to come. Now the state needs to be convinced..



O'dycéa

The 1,400 m² baths boast beautiful architecture, provide a sensory experience and a breathtaking panoramic view in the heart of the Joue du Loup resort. The balneotherapy area includes an outdoor poolside and a Norwegian bath, a large pool with waterfalls, whirlpools, bubble beds, swimming against the current, swan neck fountains, a water games area for young children and two private areas, one with a hot tub and the other with a pool with music and lighting effects. The spa area, on the other hand, has two steam baths, two saunas, a cold water well, three Cinq Mondes treatment cabins including one for couples, a herbal tea room and a relaxation zone.



Listening to glaciers at La Grave

This is a long standing project initiated by two sound artists and combining both art and science. The artists are Pali Meursault and Thomas Tilly. The objective is a radio transmission of the interior life of glaciers in July 2020. Sound sensors placed into the bowels of the glaciers will allow visitors to listen to the voices and movements of the Glacier at the top of the Glacier de la Meije Cable Cars and also on podcasts which can be accessed on the website radioglaces.net. On this temporary radio it will be possible to listen to talks by scientists as well as mountain sports enthusiasts. Their testimonials will help give people a better understanding of the strange language of glaciers.

The 107th edition of the Tour de France (June 27th - July 19th) will start in Nice and will come to the Hautes-Alpes. With a fourth stage on June 30th between Sisteron and Orcières Merlette 1850's resort (157 km) and then on July 1st from Gap to Privas (183 km).

The Tour de France will meet the Hautes-Alpes for the 83rd time since 1922 and the fifth time in six years, making the area one of the most visited of the grand tour.



Wild Land Festival

The nature magazine bears the same name as the Festival. The Wild Land Festival seeks to create emotion and wonder in order to enhance awareness of the beauty and fragility of nature.

During these 3 days, this new cultural and multidisciplinary event blends art and nature in an ambitious programme including : artistic and unusual installations in nature (exhibitions around shelters, base camp, temporary hut, etc), accompagnied hikes on different themes (ornithology, astronomy, climbing, etc.), projections, concerts, temporary bookshop and evenings around camp fires.

Authors, philosophers, producers, photographers or just mountain and nature fans gather in the Clarée as a homage to wildness and an invitation to discover the secret logic of our ecosystem.



Tour Voile

Tour Voile 2020 will sail through the turquoise waters of the Serre-Ponçon lake on the 16th and 17th of July. It is the first time ever the third's biggest sailing event in the world (behind the Vendée Globe and the Rhum Route) has chosen an inland lake in France. For 43 years, Tour Voile has never left the Northern, Channel, Brittany coasts, Atlantic and Mediterranean sea coasts to come and sail inland, at the foot of the Alps.
